



Road Maintenance and Parking Restrictions Details and Schedule for Wedgwood July – August

July 22, 2013

Dear Wedgwood Resident or Business Operator:

Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) contractors will install a microsurfacing seal coat to many streets in Wedgwood **July 29 – Aug. 2, and possibly Aug. 5 – 9.**

PROJECT OVERVIEW: Selected streets which were chip sealed in the past will receive an alternative treatment called **microsurfacing**: a thin, tough layer of asphalt emulsion blended with crushed stone. Microsurfacing preserves the streets similar to chip sealing, but without the loose rock involved with chip sealing.

LOCATION: Numerous **non-arterial streets in Wedgwood**

DATES: Each block will be microsurfaced on a specific day **Mon. Jul. 29 - Th. Aug. 1.**
****Please see the map and schedule on reverse side of flyer.**** This work is weather dependent. If rain interrupts the work, your block will be re-scheduled to Aug. 2, 5, 6, 7, or 8. Garbage, yard waste and recycling will be collected on Wednesday 7am - 8am.

HOURS OF LANE CLOSURES: Sometime **during 7am – 5pm on the scheduled date, your block will be fully closed for two to three hours** to sweep the street, apply the seal coat and let it cure (harden). These two hours can occur at any time between 7am – 5pm, but we cannot predict when these two hours will occur for a particular block.

ACCESS TO THE ROAD: “Road closed” signs will be posted on the block for up to a full workday (7am – 5pm). However, before and after the two to three hours of seal coat application and curing, you may walk or drive on the street with assistance from crews. Sidewalks will remain open. Two hours after the project is completed, “no parking” signs will be removed and you may walk or drive on the street normally.

PARKING: “No Parking” signs will be installed at least 72 hours before the start of work. **On the day your block is scheduled, please do not park on the street.** There will be no access out of or into driveways during the two to three hours of seal coat application and curing. If you park near the street, **park at least 2 feet from the edge** to prevent potential vehicle damage from overspray of the microsurfacing material. If you will need your car during the day, we recommend parking on an adjoining block that is not scheduled for microsurfacing on the same day as your own.
