

Photo Enforcement Camera Installation

Installation planned for May and June

City contractors will be installing photo enforcement cameras near your home. The cameras will issue citations to drivers that exceed the school zone speed limit of 20 mph. The school zone speed limit is in effect for typically one hour in the morning as students arrive at school, and one hour in the afternoon when the school day ends. Flashing beacons have been installed to emphasize the times when the school zone speed limit is in effect.

Cameras will issue warnings for 30 days beginning September 2 and start issuing citations in early October 2014. Additional information will be mailed to residents in August.

Photo enforcement systems will be installed for the following school zone locations:

- Roxhill Elementary on SW Roxbury Street between 25th Avenue SW and 34th Avenue SW – construction begins May 28
- Holy Family School on SW Roxbury Street between 17th Avenue SW and 24th Avenue SW – construction begins May 28
- Dearborn Park Elementary on S Orcas Street between 25th Avenue S and 32nd Avenue S – construction begins June 2
- Eckstein Middle School on NE 75th Street between 27th Avenue NE and 34th Avenue NE – construction begins June 9
- Bailey Gatzert Elementary on E Yesler Way between 13th Avenue and 17th Avenue – construction begins June 23

Project Elements

The contractor will be installing photo enforcement camera equipment which includes pavement work. Extra signage highlighting the photo enforced school zone will be installed in June.



WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Construction at each location is expected to last no more than 10 days
- Periodic lane closures
- Pedestrian detours
- Moderate construction noise
- Normal work hours will be 9 AM to 3 PM
- Access will be maintained to businesses and residences
